Refrain:

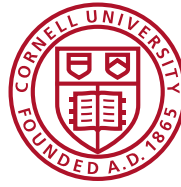
Lift the chorus, speed it onward

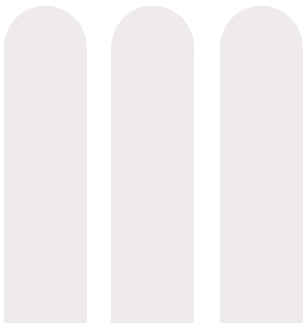
